WHEN WE WERE YOUNG AND BRAVE

In "The Wars of Our Generation" book 82 members of the Senior Men's Club of Birmingham, Michigan, wrote about their experiences in World War II and Korea. It pictured us as we look today, most in our 80s.

This "The Way We Were, A Wars Photo Album" is a pictorial companion showing us as we were some 60 years ago — when we were young and brave and handsome!

The early 1940s was a time of rising furor among the nations of Western Europe, fueled by fascist movements that sought to conquer the world and to replace freedom with tyranny. Our nation's leaders sought to avoid direct involvement, but that ended December 7, 1941, when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and World War II came to America.

As young men, our world turned upside down. Some of us were students, others farmers or new hires in business firms or a hundred other occupations. We did not want to go to war in foreign lands thousands of miles away. But we also knew if we didn't stop the increasingly powerful juggernauts of fascism over there, we might end up fighting them in our own backyard. And a decade later, we fought North Korea in the cause of freedom.

So, we went to war as citizen soldiers — on the beaches of Normandy and the Pacific islands and in the trenches of Europe and places like Okinawa and Iwo Jima. We fought on battleships and destroyers, in bombers and fighter airplanes, everywhere the enemy was. A decade later, some of us fought in places like Inchon and the 38th Parallel in Korea. Many more of us served in vital military activities supporting our fighting forces around the world.

Look at our faces as we were 60 years ago, fighting for freedom around the world — so young, brave and handsome — and forever proud.

This publication resulted from the efforts, energies and enthusiasm of a number of SMC members, including:


Chip Forbes, who originally proposed the idea of a wars memorial book for SMC members who served in World War II and Korea, and who served as overall project chairman.
