Foundation Grant to The Farm at Trinity Health Oakland, aka St. Joseph Hospital



To address nutrition and healthy needs of the community, Trinity Health Oakland supports a Farm Share Assistance (FSA) program for underserved families. The FSA program aggregates produce and food from more than 20 local farms including the Trinity Health Oakland Farm.

Volunteers pack boxes and distribute to members of the FSA weekly, for 36 weeks. The SMCF grant of \$5,000 is being used to subsidize FSA members for financially challenged seniors in our community. The program is important to those in need and has grown in size and scope each year. The Farm is also a place of solitude for hospital residents.

We will be seated at 6:45 PM for announcements and introductions, followed by dinner at 7 PM and dancing thereafter until 10:15 PM. Free valet parking service will be provided.

Tickets for this event are \$75 per person and will be on sale at our Friday meetings beginning November 1. Tickets are also available directly from Jim King at 248-645-9388. Reserved tables for groups are available upon request. We will be happy to arrange seating for couples and/or singles as well. Tables will accommodate a maximum of 8 persons for COVID distancing reasons. Table reservation forms will be available at the Special Events table beginning Friday, October 25. All ticket sales (including singles and couples) must be accompanied by a completed Table Reservation Form, so please pick one up at a Friday morning meeting or request one from Jim King.

Please consider inviting your friends and relatives to join you. We ask that groups reserving tables please designate ONE person to collect the ticket fees for the group and make ONE payment for the table when submitting the Table Reservation Form. Note any special dietary requests on the form. We will invite the members of NEXT to join us again this year.

Dinner will be served family style (all you can eat), with three entrées passed around at each table. Entrée choices will include Tenderloin of Beef with mushrooms, Chicken Piccata with capers and artichoke hearts, and Baked Orange Roughy with lemon garnish, along with side dishes of peas with mushrooms and buttered redskin potatoes. A pasta starter of Farfalle Alfredo and a mixed green salad will also be served. Dinner will conclude with a Raspberry Sundae dessert. 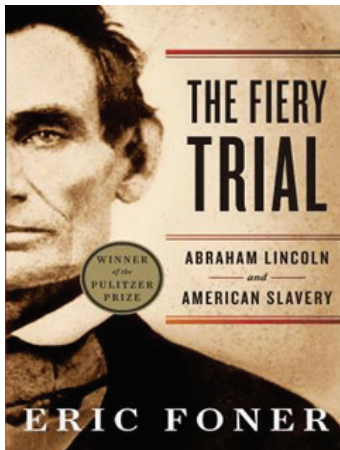


MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY READING GROUPS

The second continues our investigation of the challenges and opportunities presented by Artificial Intelligence. Thanks to Roger Timm and Jim Labes for bringing these to our attention.

Wednesday, November 6 at 10:30 AM: *The Fiery Trial: Abraham Lincoln and American Slavery* by Eric Foner (New York: W.W. Norton and Company, 2010) This discussion will be led by Roger Timm.



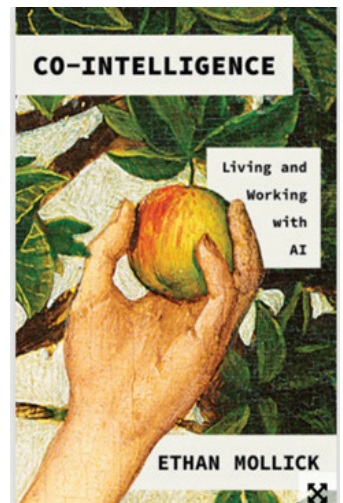
This landmark work gives us a definitive account of Lincoln's lifelong engagement with the nation's critical issue: American slavery. A master historian, Eric Foner draws Lincoln and the broader history of the period into perfect balance. We see Lincoln, a pragmatic politician grounded in principle, deftly navigating the dynamic politics of antislavery, secession, and civil war. Lincoln's greatness emerges from his capacity for moral and political growth.

From the New York Times review: "Do we need yet another book on Lincoln?... Well, yes, we do — if the book is by so richly informed a commentator as Eric Foner, the DeWitt Clinton professor of history at Columbia. Foner tackles what would seem to be an obvious topic, Lincoln and slavery, and manages to cast new light on it."

Monday, November 18 at 3 PM: *Co-intelligence: Living and Working with AI* by Ethan Mollick (New York: Portfolio Books, 2024) Jim Labes will lead this discussion

Something new entered our world in November 2022 — the first general purpose AI that could pass for a human and do the kinds of creative, innovative work that only humans could do previously. Wharton professor Ethan Mollick immediately understood what ChatGPT meant: after millions of years on our own, humans had developed a kind of co-intelligence that could augment, or even replace, human thinking. Through his writing, speaking, and teaching, Mollick has become one of the most prominent and provocative explainers of AI, focusing on the practical aspects of how these new tools for thought can transform our world.

CLASSIC MOVIE GROUP



On Monday, November 11th at 1:00 PM, Tom Booth will present, via Zoom, the political/war/thriller classic "The Manchurian Candidate" (1962) (2 hours / 6 minutes). Directed by John Frankenheimer, the story begins near the end of the Korean War when a platoon of US G.I.s are captured by the North Koreans and put through a series of horrible mind-altering experiments, that are then buried in their subconscious minds, before they are released from captivity. After the war, the platoon arrives home, and Sergeant Raymond Shaw (Laurence Harvey) is lauded as a hero. However, the platoon commander, Captain Bennett Marco (Frank Sinatra), finds himself plagued with strange nightmares that he feels somehow relate to his ordeals in captivity. As he searches, and begins to find meaning to his dreams, with the help of his compassionate girlfriend (Janet Leigh), he uncovers a diabolical Communist plot, orchestrated by Harvey's sinister mother (Angela Lansbury), to upend the upcoming Presidential Election.

The film was both a critical and commercial success when released at the height of US-Soviet hostility during the Cuban Missile Crisis and continues to be highly regarded by audiences to this day. The movie has a Rotten Tomatoes score of 97% and IMDb rating of 7.9/10.

So, mark your calendars now and plan to join Tom, and the rest of our Group, on November 11, to watch and discuss this fascinating neo-noir psychological political thriller which is considered to be one of the most iconic films of the Cold War period.
